

Body Ponders Civil Service

More Meets Set On State Proposal

SALEM, Nov. 11 (Special)—The interim committee of the 1943 legislature, to study a proposal for civil service for state employees, will hold at least one and possibly two more meetings before filing its report with the governor, W. W. Chadwick, Salem, a member of the committee, declared Thursday.

First meeting of the committee was held in Portland Monday of this week, when a number of public employees appeared and advanced reasons why a civil service law should be enacted.

Chadwick said several members of the committee apparently were of the opinion that a civil service proposal should not be presented at the 1945 legislative session due to the fact that many state employees are in the armed forces and may not return in time to be heard.

Civil service proposals, involving state employees, were defeated at both the 1941 and 1943 legislative sessions.

The report of the committee must be filed with the governor not later than December 1, 1944.
